COUNT ME IN

MATERIALS NEEDED

• small piece of paper (1 per student)

Step 1

The teacher writes 3-5 of the prompts from Snapshots! videos on the board.

My favorite food is
My favorite city is
My favorite holiday is
My favorite animal is
My favorite exercise is

Step 2

On a blank piece of paper, students write their answers, but not their names.

Step 3

The teacher gathers the students into a circle and asks the students to crumple their papers into a ball before tossing them into the middle of the circle.

Step 4

Students choose a ball of paper, open it, and read the answers. Students try to find the owner by wandering through the group and asking questions.

Optional

Once a student finds the owner, they can ask them to explain their answers. Steps 3-4 can be repeated several times.

STAND WHERE YOU STAND

MATERIALS NEEDED

• paper and tape for possible answers (optional)

Step 1


The teacher shares a *Snapshots*! video sentence starter on the board and/or reads it out loud.

Step 2

The teacher assigns a specific spot or corner in the room for each answer. (This can be indicated orally or by posting a piece of paper with the answer in the assigned location.)

Step 3

Students move to a specific spot in the room, or in a corner, and stand together to show which answer best matches their answer.



Step 4

Students choose a ball of paper, open it, and read the answers. Students try to find the owner by wandering through the group and asking questions.

Optional

The teacher can ask students to discuss why they chose this answer and select 1 person from each group to share with the whole class.

QUIZ, QUIZ, TRADE

MATERIALS NEEDED

· cards with individual prompts/questions from Snapshots videos

Step 1

Teacher hands out cards with prepared questions matching answers from Snapshots! videos.

What are three words you would use to describe yourself?

How can someone win a gold star with you?

Step 2

Each student finds a partner and asks/answers the questions.

Step 3

Students trade cards, and repeat Step 2 with a new partner. (This can be repeated several times.)

Optional

For shy students or a large class, students can participate as small groups. Advanced students can ask follow-up questions before moving from Step 2 to Step 3.

ELEPHANT, PALM TREE, JELLO

MATERIALS NEEDED

None

Step 1

Teacher gives students time to share answers to the Snapshots! video prompt "If I were stranded on a desert island and could only have three things with me, they would be______, ____, and ______, and ______, ".

Step 2

Students gather in a circle and create/learn gestures and sounds for each of 3 popular items. Each gesture should include 3 people. (Note: sounds and gestures can be silly.) Everyone practices the gestures and sound for each item several times.



Step 3

The instructor calls out an item and points to a student to start the team gesture and sound. Surrounding students complete the gesture and join in making the sound. If someone makes a mistake or takes too long, they are out.

Step 4

Repeat until only 3 winning students remain.

COUNT ME IN

MATERIALS NEEDED

• artist's song and audio player

Step 1

Students walk or dance around the room in a circle while music plays.

Step 2

Teacher pauses the song and calls out a number.

Step 3

Students must get into corresponding groups as quickly as possible. Left over students are out.

Step 4

Repeat until there are only 2 students left as winners.

Washington, D.C. based BLACK ALLEY has been pushing the art of music to its rhythmic limits for some time now. Determined to create a unique musical elixir, Black Alley has taken the finest ingredients of rock, hip-hop, and go-go to create their own genre-bending sound called "Hood Rock".

With endorsements from national recording artists such as Raheem DeVaughn and Jill Scott; hip-hop standouts Common, Big KRIT, & Wale; producers Tone P and Chucky Thompson; super engineer Young Guru; and legendary musicians Doug E.
